RE: The LLNL Site Profile under the Energy Employees Occupational Illness Compensation Program Act (EEOICPA)

A team from the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) and its support contractor would like to discuss the Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory Site Profile. This report describes radiation exposures and monitoring at LLNL over the years. The Site Profile will be used to help re-construct radiation doses for LLNL workers and former workers who have filed claims for cancer under the Energy Employees Occupational Illness Compensation Program Act.

Input from workers and former workers is valuable in making the Site Profile as accurate as possible, so that dose reconstructions that rely on information in the Site Profile can be as precise and consistent as possible.

The meetings will provide an opportunity for individuals who have reviewed parts of the Site Profile to comment. In addition, there will be information on the types of input that will be helpful and how that can be submitted.
